Move from Craigieburn for 12 months

SUNBURY'S Victoria University campus will be leased to Hume Anglican Grammar this year after months of speculation. University classes finished last year after it was announced in 2008 that the campus would close. Management and capital services deputy vice-chancellor Jon Hickman said in a press release that the school would lease the

campus for 12 months, moving in this month and operating from January 27. The school approached the university only days before Christmas. Despite many attempts, the *Leader* was unable to get a comment from Mr Hickman, who at one stage said he was golfing and could not say whether the school

would have an ongoing lease if plans for its own campus were delayed beyond the 12 months. *Leader* was unable to ask what parts of the campus would be leased and about the future of community users such as 3NRG and the Boilerhouse Theatre Company or the long term plans for the site. Hume Anglican Grammar has

about 350 students and 40 staff from prep to year 10. It was based temporarily in Craigieburn for the past two years and objectors to a planned permanent site at Mt Ridley homestead in Mickleham meant a new campus was not ready for this year. Principal Andrew Mackenzie said letters were posted to parents

on Christmas Eve explaining the campus change. He said prep to grade 4 students would stay at the Craigieburn site for term one. The school will pay for students to travel by bus on the 28km trip.
